Guy's last Chess album finds him shifting gears to keep up with the scene. The rest of the album is filled with groovy, soul-styled workouts; some of them succeed and some sound a bit dated, but overall this is one of Buddy's stronger efforts. ---Cub Koda, allmusic.com
