Many famous artists, like Manfred Krug, Günther Fischer, Reinhard Lakomy, Henning Protzmann, Günter Baby Sommer and Ulrich Gumpert, learned from his musical craft and played with him on many successful albums. Klaus Lenz played with ever-changing casts, a testament to his constant search for new forms of musical expression. With each formation, reaching a high standard.
