In 1962, Lita signed with Ember Records, recording a single, a fine revival of Ruth Brown's 'Mama, He Treats Your Daughter Mean' (b/w '(He's My) Dreamboat') and an LP, Love Songs For Night People, the following year. Both were well-reviewed at the time of their release and are much sought-after artifacts by Lita's fans.
