Phil Ochs was a singer/songwriter during the 1960's (variously categorized as ``topical", ``protest" and ``folk"). He was a contemporary (and friend) of Bob Dylan. (who said: ``I just can't keep up with Phil. And he's getting better and better and better.") He was a prolific writer of protest songs such as Draft Dodger Rag, I Ain't Marchin' Anymore and Outside Of A Small Circle Of Friends.
